Craig Kielburger is the founder and chair of Free The Children, a unique international development and youth empowerment organization. Since 1995, Free The Children has become the world's leading youth-driven charity, inspiring an entire generation to stand up and have their voices heard. Craig is also the co-founder and director of Me to We, a social enterprise that makes ethical living the norm while helping Free The Children achieve financial sustainability.

Craig has a degree in Peace and Conflict Studies from the University of Toronto and is the youngest-ever graduate of the Kellogg-Schulich Executive MBA program. Craig has traveled to more than 50 countries, visiting underprivileged children and helping with humanitarian projects and development initiatives. He has been awarded many national and international awards for his work, including The Roosevelt Freedom Medal, The World Children's Prize for the Rights of the Child (often called the Children's Nobel Prize) and he is one of the youngest recipients of The Order of Canada.

Marie Battiste

Dr. Marie Battiste, a Mi'kmaq educator from Potlo'tek First Nations, Nova Scotia, is a full professor in the College of Education, Director of the Aboriginal Education Research Centre (AERC) at the University of Saskatchewan. A graduate of Harvard University (M.Ed.) and Stanford University (Ed.D.), she has writings in cognitive imperialism, linguistic and cultural integrity, indigenous knowledge and humanities, and decolonization of Aboriginal education.

Suzanne Zwarych

Suzanne is the Executive Director for Western Canada of the Canadian Safe School Network and the Prairie Regional Coordinator for Violence Prevention Programs with the Canadian Prevention Science Cluster for Children & Youth, based at the University of Saskatchewan. Suzanne's research examines how school structure affects the nature of student-student and student-teacher relationships and impacts student alienation.

Ray Hughes

Ray Hughes has 30 years of experience in education. He is currently the National Education Coordinator of the Fourth R Project with the CAMH Centre for Prevention Science, as well as an educational consultant and research associate with CREVAWC at the University of Western Ontario. Previously, Ray was the Learning Coordinator for Safe Schools with the Thames Valley D.S.B., and was appointed to the Ontario Ministry of Education's Safe School Action Team.

Andrew Judge

Andrew Judge was born and raised in London, Ontario; he is a non-status member of Thessalon First Nation. Andrew is currently completing a Masters degree in Aboriginal education at The University of Western Ontario's Faculty of Education and assists with the CAMH Centre for Prevention Science team for 2 years and is involved with various 4th R programs designed for Aboriginal youth.
